1) INTRODUCTION:

The B.Com Degree Course (2019 pattern) will be introduced in the following order:-

First Year B.Com. 2019-2020
 Second Year B.Com. 2020-2021
 Third Year B.Com. 2021-2022

- ✓ B.Com. Degree Course will consist of six semesters divided into three Years.
- ✓ The first year (Semester I and II), Second Year (Semester III and IV) and Third Year (Semester V and VI) Choice Based Credit System Examination will be held at the end of each semester.

2) ELIGIBILITY:

- a) No Candidates shall be admitted to the First Year of the B.Com. Degree Course (2019 pattern) unless he/she has passed the Higher Secondary School Certificate Examination of the Maharashtra State Board of Higher Secondary Education Board or equivalent or University with English as a passing Course.
- b) No candidate shall be admitted to the Third Semester examination of the second year unless he/ she has cleared first two semesters satisfactorily for the course at the college affiliated to this University.
- c) No candidate shall be admitted to the Third Year B.Com. (Fifth Semester) Degree Course (2019 pattern) unless he/she has cleared all the papers of first and second-semester Examination of F.Y. B.Com. and has satisfactorily kept terms for the second year (Third and Fourth Semester).

3) A.T.K.T. Rules:

- ➤ If a candidate fails in all the courses (subject heads) of the passing of semester I shall be allowed to proceed semester II. However, a student who fails in **seven** theory courses and **one** practical course at semester I and II taken together may be admitted to semester III & IV.
- ➤ If a candidate fails in all the courses (subject heads) of the passing of semester III shall be allowed to proceed to semester IV. However, a student who fails in **six** theory courses and **two** practical courses at semester III and IV taken together may be admitted to semester V & VI.
- ➤ If a candidate fails in all the courses (subject heads) of the passing of semester V shall be allowed to proceed to semester VI. No candidate shall be allowed to proceed to semester V unless the candidate has cleared semester I & II in all courses (Subjects and Practicals).
- ➤ ATKT rules are applicable for 2nd and 4th semester.

4) COURSES CARRYING PRACTICALS:

- a) Each practical course will be of one credit.
- **b)** There will be a practical and viva-voce examination for the semester I and II of the F.Y.B.Com. for the Course Financial Accounting.
- c) There will be practical and practical examinations for the special Courses (Discipline Special Elective) of S.Y.B.Com. (Semester III and IV) and of T.Y.B.Com. (Semester V & VI)
- **d)** There will be Practical for the S.Y.B.Com level Compulsory Practical Course Business Communication (Semester III and IV) & for T.Y.B.Com Auditing and Taxation (Semester V and VI)
- e) A Student must offer the same Special Course at T.Y.B.Com. (Semester V & VI) which he/she has offered at S.Y.B.Com. (Semester III and IV)

6) MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION:

The medium of instruction for B.Com Degree course shall be English except for languages.

7) DURABILITY

The course shall be a full-time course and the duration of the course shall be for three years.

8) ATTENDANCE:

No candidate shall be admitted to the semester end examinations unless he/ she has satisfactorily completed 75% of attendance for both the semesters.

9) UNIVERSITY TERMS:

The dates for the commencement and conclusion of the first and the second terms shall be as determined by the University Authorities. Only duly admitted students can keep the terms. The present relevant ordinances pertaining to grant of terms will be applicable.

10) VERIFICATION AND REVALUATION:

The candidate may apply for verification and revaluation of result through Principal of the College which will be done by the **COLLEGE** as per ordinance framed in that behalf.

11) STANDARD OF PASSING:

- ➤ A student must obtain a minimum of 30% marks in Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE), and minimum 40% marks in Practical Examination and Semester End Examination.
- ➤ It means that passing separately in Internal Assessment, Practical Examination and Semester End Examination is compulsory.
- The student has to secure at least 40 marks (40%) in the total assessment (100 Marks) for each subject.
- ➤ If the student doesn't secure 40% in the total assessment but has secured the minimum passing requirement i.e. 30% marks in Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) and minimum 40% marks in Semester End Examination, he/she would be permitted to appear for any one of or both of Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) and Semester End Examination.
- ➤ Students who are failed in Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) of any odd semester can reappear for the same only in the next odd semester and vice-versa. E.g. students failed in 1st semester can reappear in 3rd semester only and students failed in 2nd semester can appear in 4th semester only.

12) METHODS OF EVALUATION, PASSING, AND EVALUATION CRITERIA:

The evaluation of students will be done on three parameters:-

- **a.** Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE)
- b. Practical Examination (List of Courses having practical is given in Note No. 4)
- c. Semester End Examination

For Semester End Examination, question papers will be set for sixty marks (two hours duration).

For Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE), Evaluation will be done continuously. Internal assessment will be of **40** marks. These 40 marks are divided as follows:

- ➤ There will be compulsory MCQ Examination of **20** marks of each Practical and Non-practical subject.
- ➤ 5 marks are reserved for **Students Active Participation** in the classroom for non-practical subjects.

- ➤ There will be a compulsory Practical Exam of subjects mentioned in **NOTE 4** for **20 Marks**.
- For non-practical subjects (15 Marks), the subject teacher needs to adopt anyone out of the following methods for internal assessment:
 - a. Quiz
 - **b.** Presentations
 - c. Projects
 - d. Assignments
 - e. Tutorials
 - f. Oral examination
 - g. Open book test etc.

13) STRUCTURE OF TRANSCRIPT:

Conversion of percentage into credit(s) and grade(s): The following illustrations could be taken as an example for computing SGPA and CGPA from percentage to credits for Honours courses in all disciplines, degree program courses in Science subjects and degree Program courses in humanities, Social Sciences and Commerce subjects:

- ❖ Minor variations may be adjusted by the individual institution.
- 1) A student obtaining Grade F shall be considered failed and will be required to reappear in the examination.
- 2) For non-credit courses 'Satisfactory' or 'unsatisfactory' shall be indicated instead of the letter grade and this will not be counted for the computation of SGPA/CGPA.
- 3) The universities can decide on the or percentage of marks required to pass in a course and also the CGPA required to qualify for a degree taking into consideration the

- recommendations of the statutory professional councils such as AICTE, MCI, BCI, NCTE etc.
- 4) The statutory requirement for eligibility to enter as an assistant professor in colleges and universities in the disciplines of arts, science, commerce etc. is a minimum average mark of 50% and 55% in relevant postgraduate degree respectively for reserved and general category.
